13251 Girls Choir 1 / 13252 Boys Choir 1 – No audition required. Emphasis will be placed on good vocal production, part singing, and music reading skills. Rehearsals and performances outside of class time are part of the course requirement and will constitute a portion of the grade. This is a full year class.

13060/13070/13080 Band 1 Woodwinds, Brass, Percussion– a beginning level course. NO EXPERIENCE NEEDED. The following instruments are taught: Flute, Oboe, Bassoon, Clarinet, Saxophone, Trumpet, French Horn, Trombone, Euphonium, Tuba, Percussion (both mallet and drums, piano experience strongly recommended). Those interested in Saxophone need to start the year off on clarinet. Half way through the school year we will switch those students to saxophone. Students need to provide their own instrument and book. The school does own some instruments that may be rented out. Supplies are provided for those on fee waiver.

13520 Percussion Ensemble – Instructor approval required - Class for students who wish to learn the drums, mallet keyboard instruments and other percussion –related instruments. Practice outside of class time and performances are part of this course. Instrument required.

13460 Concert Band – Instructor approval required- An intermediate-level band class. Rehearsals and performances outside of class time are part of the course requirement and will constitute a portion of the grade. Instrument required.

13020 Orchestra 1 – No experience necessary. This class is for students who would like to learn to play a violin, viola, cello, or string bass. One-half hour daily practice required. Instrument required.

13040 Orchestra 3 - Prerequisite: Instructor approval (Audition and/or interview possible) This is an orchestra class focusing on advanced-level literature for orchestra. Rehearsals and performances outside of class time are part of the course requirement and will constitute a portion of the grade. Practice outside of class time with instrument is required.

10261 Art Foundation 1 - This class will cover the first 13 concepts of art outlined in the State Guide. Students will participate in opportunities to “make art.” Students will also develop skills in drawing, compositions—looking at and talking about art and recognizing works of famous artists. There are no prerequisites for this class, but this class is a prerequisite to other art classes.

10277 Art Foundation 2 - Prerequisite: Art Foundation 1 - Art Foundation 2 class for 7th grade only. Art Foundation 2 provides an overview and introduction to visual arts through studying a variety of art tools and materials. This course builds on Foundations 1 with a more in-depth experience with fewer art forms. This course is designed to develop higher-level thinking, art-related technology skills, art criticism, art history, and aesthetics, with an emphasis on studio production.

16007 Intro to Theatre – This is an introductory course in theatre with an emphasis on performance. No previous experience is necessary. The course will include pantomime, improvisation, mono acts, characterization, and scenes from plays, play reading, and work with voice projection and diction.

41991 World Language Exploration – This course is designed to provide students with a rotating introduction to languages offered at their school. Focusing on listening and speaking skills, students will develop world language study strategies and acquire a variety of vocabulary sets.

71467 Dance 1 – This course offers basic dance techniques, fitness fundamentals, movement qualities, and rhythm with an emphasis on creativity, sequencing, and problem solving.

83131 Keyboarding 1 – In this beginning semester keyboarding course, students will master touch operation on a computer keyboard. Speed and accuracy will be stressed.
