Full Year 1. _____

10262 Art Foundation 1 - *Students should make sure they did not have this class in 7th grade. This class will cover the first 13 concepts of art outlined in the State Guide. Students will participate in opportunities to “make art.” Students will also develop skills in drawing, compositions—looking at and talking about art and recognizing works of famous artists. There are no prerequisites for this class, but this class is a prerequisite to other art classes. \$10 fee

10271 Art Foundation 2 – Prerequisite: Art Foundation 1 - This class reviews and builds on the concepts learned in Foundation Design 1. More advanced concepts in creating works of art will be taught with an emphasis on composition. \$10 fee

10291 Ceramics - Ceramics develops basic skills in the creation of 3-D forms and pottery from clay. \$10 fee

10441 Drawing - This class focuses on black and white or monochromatic rendering from life, pictures, masterworks, and imagination. With an emphasis on studio production, this course is designed to develop higher level thinking and art-related technology skills. Some experiences in art criticism, art history and aesthetics may be included. \$10 fee

10461 Painting 1 - Painting 1 includes wet and dry color media with processes such as transparent and opaque painting focusing on the operations of color. \$10 fee

16001 Beginning Theatre – This is an introductory course in theatre with an emphasis on performance. No previous experience is necessary. The course will include pantomime, improvisation, mono acts, and characterization scenes from plays, play reading, and work with voice projection and diction.

16011 Intermediate Theatre- Prerequisite: Beginning Theatre or Instructor Approval: This is an intermediate course in theatre with an emphasis on performance. The course will include dramatic and humorous readings, mono acts, and scenes from plays, pantomime, and an overview of the history of theatre, puppetry, radio, T.V. and film.

46551 Creative Writing – Students will explore and develop their interests and skills in the field of creative writing. It is the intent of this course to expose students to narrative writing, poetry, drama, and essay. Other genres of creative writing may also be explored.

71461 Dance 1 – A course offering basic dance technique, fitness fundamentals, movement qualities, and rhythm, with an emphasis on creativity, sequencing, and problem solving.

71471 Dance 2 – This course designed to develop dance technique, flexibility, and coordination, with an emphasis on creativity and artistic composition.

80011 Exploring Technology – Exploring Technology is action-based course that introduces students to the technological systems of two or more of the following areas: energy-power technologies, information and communications technologies, transportation technologies, manufacturing technologies, and construction technologies. The course is designed around exploration in cooperative and individualized activities rather than project and skill development. \$10 Lab fee

83131 Keyboarding 1 – In this beginning semester keyboarding course, students will master touch operation on a computer keyboard. Speed and accuracy will be stressed.

83471 Exploring Business and Marketing – Students will be exposed to the fundamental concepts of business and marketing. Skills include basic business concepts, organizational communication, human resources management, entrepreneurship, accounting, finance, and leadership.

87061 FACS Exploration Foods – This Family and Consumer Science course provides students with essential life skills. The course allows students to develop skills in food and nutrition. \$10 lab fee

87062 FACS Exploration Clothing – an exploratory course where we will learn about Interior Design, Textiles, Clothing Construction, Fashion Design, and Free Enterprise. Students will need to pay a \$10 fee and supply their own project materials. The school will help supply materials for those students on fee waiver
